Changing the date of the eyes camp

Announcing the launch of a free camp to treat eye diseases and reduce blindness at Juba Teaching Hospital

The African Cooperation Organization for Development and Humanitarian Aid, in cooperation with the International Sight Foundation and under the supervision of the Ministry of Health of the Republic of South Sudan, announces the launch of a free camp to treat eye diseases and reduce blindness at Juba Teaching Hospital, during the period from August 01 to August 7, 2026 AD, with the participation of an elite group of eye specialists and surgeons from the Republic of Sudan and the Republic of South Sudan.

The camp aims to provide free medical services to citizens, as it aims to examine and treat (6,000) patients, perform (500) eye surgeries, and distribute free medicines, in addition to distributing (2,500) medical glasses to the beneficiaries according to the medical evaluation.

This camp comes within the framework of humanitarian efforts aimed at combating the causes of blindness and providing specialized health care to the most needy groups.

We call on all patients in need to attend and benefit from the camp's services. We also call on all local and international media to cover the camp's activities and contribute to spreading awareness of the importance of preventing eye diseases and the impact of these humanitarian initiatives in serving society.
