By – Laws 2013

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Juba City Council By-Law 2013 amended 2025

In accordance with the provisions of section (39/1.2) read together with section (40/1,2,3) of the Local Government Act, 2009, Juba City Legislative council, shall enact by – laws to regulate the work, conduct and behaviour of the citizens in Juba City within the limits of its jurisdiction.



Chapter One

Preliminary provisions

1. Title and Commencement:

These by-laws may be cited as Juba City Council By-Laws 2013 amended 2025 'and shall come into force on the ratification by Juba City Legislative Council with the assent of H.W Mayor of Juba City Council.

2. Repeal and saving:

The by-laws 2013amended 2025is hereby repealed , provided that, all orders and regulations made or issued there under shall remain in force until they are repealed or amended in accordance with the provisions of these By-Laws.

3. Purpose:

The purpose of these by-laws is to regulate the work of Juba City Council and provide the Penalties (fines, imprisonment, closure, confiscation and warning) which govern the criminal acts or violation of the provisions of these by-laws or local orders that may be adjudicated upon by the Courts, and any other issues related thereto.

4. Authority and Application:

- (1) These By-Laws is made in accordance with the provisions of section (37/1,2) of the Local Government Act 2009 , which grants the Juba City Legislative Council authority to enact legislation for establishment of the system in Juba City Council.
- (2) The provisions of these By-laws shall be applied to all public institutions and private business and all people within Juba City.

5. Interpretations:

In these By-laws unless the context otherwise requires, the following words and expressions shall have the meanings assigned to them respectively:

“By-Laws” means any local legislation made by council in accordance with the provisions of local Government Act, 2009.

“Provisional orders” means orders having force of law issued by H.W the Mayor in the absence or when the legislative council is on recess.

‘City Council’ means a Council established in an urban area in accordance with the provisions of local government Act, 2009.

“Legislative Council” means the elected legislative Council of Juba City Council.

“Mayor” means the elected Mayor of Juba City Council.

“Chief Executive Officer” means the head of civil servants of Juba City Council.

“Block Council” means the coordinative unit of the Juba City Council comprised of a number of Quarter Councils, which shall exercises delegated powers within the Council.

“Quarter Council” means basic administrative unit of Block Council, which shall exercises, de-concentrated powers.

“Chairperson” means the chairperson of a Juba City Legislative Council elected by the councillors.

“Councillor” means the elected member of Block Council.

“City Council Guards” means City council local law enforcer.

“Goods” means manufactured goods, locally produce or imported by the seller.

“Property” means the general property in goods.

“Seller” means a person who sells goods.

“Buyer” means a person who buys goods.

“Confiscation” means to take something away from somebody legally.

“Auction” means any property to be sold out to public by government or owner

“Public order” means law enforcer to maintain public tranquillity and behaviour.

Terms not specifically defined herein, which are defined in other laws in force, shall have the meanings set force in those laws, unless the context is inconsistent.

Chapter Two

Guiding principles

6. Guiding Principles

- (1) Juba City Council (Local Government Councils) is the third level of government in Republic of South Sudan.
- (2) The establishment of Juba City Council (Local Government Councils) based on the principles of decentralization that, demands devolution of the authority and powers to the lowest level close to the people.
- (3) Juba City Council Blocks are community government which exists at the level of Quarter Councils closest to the people.
- (4) Juba City Council institutions shall be committed, respected and promoted.

Chapter Three

Cleaning of Juba City

7. Cleaning of Houses and Business Places:

- (1) Every person is required to clean his/her house and its surrounding up to the neighbour and the road near by every day.
- (2) Whoever allows his/her house and its surroundings to be littered with garbage (plastic bottles or nylon bags) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 20,000 SSP, or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two week or with both.
- (3) All owners of business places are required to clean their business places and surrounding up to the neighbour and the road nearby every day.
- (4) Whoever allows his/her business place and its surrounding to be littered with garbage (plastic bottles or nylon bags) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 200,000 SSP for unclean environments found in his/her place or imprisonment for a term not exceeding Two Weeks or with both or his /her business place shall be closed.
- (5) All occupants of government houses in Juba City are required to clean their compounds and immediate surroundings up to the neighbour or the road nearby.
- (6) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 20,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two week or with both.
- (7) All Government institutions, private sectors and NGOs are required to clean their compounds and surrounding up to the neighbour and the road nearby every day.

- (8) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 150,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.
- (9) All business places and markets around Juba City are required not to use plastic bags for services.
- (10) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 200,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month and confiscation of the plastic bags or with both.

8. Littering and Dumping of waste along the streets or open spaces:

- (1) No agency or public institutions, or private vehicles shall be allowed to littered or throw or dump waste besides the streets or roads or open spaces.
- (2) Any agency or public institutions or private vehicles who contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or with both or the vehicles used shall be confiscated.
- (3) No person shall be allowed to litter or dump or throw waste into the main streets, open spaces, and the streams nearby.
- (4) Any person who contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two weeks or with both.
- (5) All collected garbage must be kept in containers with well fitted lid or in garbage designated bag till final disposal.
- (6) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 20,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one week or with both.
- (7) All waste water must be drained into a proper built cesspool a covered soak away pit.

- (8) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 250,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.
- (9) All persons are prohibited from burning garbage in their premises that can cause environmental pollution.
- (10) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 20,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one week or with both.
- (11) All garage owners are required to re-organize their places and immediately arrange to evacuate all cars and machineries lying on the premises which provide ground for breeding of mosquitoes, and hide out for rodents.
- (12) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 250,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or with both.
- (13) All big truck drivers are required to dispose their waste safely after offloading goods.
- (14) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months or with both.

9. Allowing, Letting water or Urine into the Streets or open spaces:

- (1) No Institution, Hotel, Lodge, Restaurants, Guesthouses or local Bars shall be allowed to let or allow water or urine from his/her place into the neighbour or street or open space.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months or with both.
- (3) No person shall be allowed to allow or let water or urine from his/her bath Sheller to neighbour or street or open space.

- (4) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 20,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one week or with both.
- (5) All health Officers have the right to enter any house or place within Juba City for inspection.
- (6) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one week or with both.

10. Washing of Cars along the main Roads:

- (1) No person shall be allowed to wash cars or motorcycles along the main roads without approval from Block Council concern or Juba City Council.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 20,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one week or with both and confiscation of the washing machine.

11. Garbage fees monthly payment:

- (1) All house owners are required to pay their monthly garbage's fees.
- (2) Whoever fails to pay his/her monthly fees shall be warned for the first time.
- (3) Whoever contravenes this sub-section for the second time shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 20,000 SSP or imprisonment for term not exceeding one month.
- (4) All shops within residential areas are required to pay their monthly garbage's fees.
- (5) Whoever fails to pay his/her monthly fees shall be warned for the first time.

- (6) Whoever contravenes this sub-section for second time shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.
- (7) All business places and markets are required to pay their monthly garbage's fees.
- (8) Whoever fails to pay his/her monthly fees shall be warned for the first time.
- (9) Whoever contravenes this sub-section for the second time shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 100,000SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.
- (10) All government and private institutions are required to pay their monthly garbage's fees.
- (11) Whoever fails to pay his/her monthly fees shall be warned for the first time.
- (12) Whoever contravenes this sub-section for the second time shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 100,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.
- (13) All workshop places are required to pay their monthly garbage fees.
- (14) Whoever fails to pay his/her monthly fees shall be warned for the first time.
- (15) Whoever contravenes this sub-section for the second time shall be liable for fine 50,000 SSP or imprisonment not exceeding one month.
- (16) All restaurant, lodges, guesthouses are required to pay their monthly garbage fees.
- (17) Whoever fails to pay his/her monthly fees shall be warned for the first time

- (18) Whoever contravenes this sub-section for the second time shall be liable for a fine 150,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.
- (19) All hotel places are required to pay their monthly garbage fees.
- (20) Whoever fails to pay his/her monthly fees shall be warned for the first time.
- (21) Whoever contravenes this sub-section for the second time shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 250,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.
- (22) All bakeries places are required to pay their monthly garbage fees. Whoever fails to pay his/her monthly fees shall be warned for the first time
- (23) Whoever contravenes this sub-section for the second time shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 100,000SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.
- (24) All pharmacies, private hospitals and clinics are required to pay their monthly garbage's fees.
- (25) Whoever fails to pay his/her monthly fees shall be warned for the first time.
- (26) Whoever contravenes this sub-section for the second time shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 100,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.

Chapter Four

Sale of Goods

12. Sale of Goods:

- (1) No person shall be allowed to sell his/her goods along the main roads or streets in Juba City.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two weeks or with both and confiscation of goods.

13. Sale or Distribution of expired or illicit Goods:

- (1) No person, whole seller or retailer shall be allowed to sell or distribute expired or illicit goods.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,000,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding five months or with both and confiscation of the goods for complete disposal.
- (3) Whoever repeats the default for three times the license will be withdrawn in collaboration with other laws.

14. Display of goods in Verandas:

- (1) No person shall be allowed to display his/her goods in verandas and in front of his/her shop.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 200,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two weeks or withdrawals of business license or with both.

15. Maintenance of shops:

- (1) All persons of business places in Juba City are required to carry out maintenance of their places annually (in the beginning of the year) as follows:
 - (a) The inside walls shall be painted with white colour.
 - (b) The outside walls shall be painted with cream colour.
 - (c) The doors shall be painted with light blue colour.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 100,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two weeks or their business places shall be closed down.

16. Shops with temporary building materials:

- (1) All shops in Juba City, residential areas and along the main roads, constructed with temporary building materials shall be constructed with permanent materials.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,000,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months or with both and withdrawal of business license.

17. Security lights:

- (1) All business places are required to install Security lights at all business premises.
- (2) Whoever fails to install the security lights shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three weeks or with both?

18. Business Trade Name:

- (3) All business places, Private companies, Agencies are required to install their business name in a visible place and cancel the old one with approval from concern authorities Juba city council (Juba block, Kator block, Munuki block e.g.)
- (4) Whoever fails to install the business name shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three weeks for the first time or both for second time.

Repairing and Spraying of Vehicles

19. Repairing and Spraying of Vehicles:

- (1) No person shall be allowed to engage in repair or patch of motor vehicles and dispose oil refuses along the main streets or in the residential areas.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months or with both.
- (3) All absolute (Scraps) of cars are not allowed to be kept by the road sides or in front of building, residential houses or in public places.
- (4) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 100,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.
- (5) No person is allowed to dismantle Cars for purpose of maintenance in the public streets, under the trees, in front of the building, public institutions, or in residential areas unless with approval from City Council Authority.
- (6) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.

20. Panel Biting and Spraying Cars in Garages:

- (1) All garage Owners or Agencies are required to carry out panel biting and spray of Cars after obtaining approval from Public Security and Traffic Police.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 100,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months or withdrawal of license and if he/she found without

business license should be liable for fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three weeks or with both.

- (3) All garages are not allowed to operate within residential areas or in the streets or in open spaces or squares.
- (4) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 75,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months or the vehicles found shall be confiscated or with both.

21. Carpentry and Welding Workshops:

- (1) All Carpentry workshop Owners are required to keep their Sawdust in garbage designated bags for safe disposal.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.
- (3) All Owners of welding shops are not allowed to display their product along the main roads or residential areas and to keep their waste scraps inside their shops.
- (4) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.

22. Burial within Residential Areas:

- (1) No dead person shall be buried within residential area, only shall be in authorized public graveyards or cemeteries with Death Certificate.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 20,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.

23. Building within Graveyards:

- (1) No person shall be allowed to construct a permanent Building within the graveyard.
- (2) Whoever constructs a permanent building within a graveyard areas shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 250,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding five months and the structure will be demolished.
- (3) No person shall be allowed to practice trading in grave yard.
- (4) Whoever practices trading in graveyards shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 150,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months and the goods shall be confiscated.
- (5) No person shall be allowed to erect any temporary shelters for the purpose of living in the grave yard.
- (6) Whoever erects any temporary shelters within graveyard shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 150,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months and the structure erected shall be demolished.
- (7) No person shall be allowed to dump any garbage into Graveyard or drain waste water into graveyards.
- (8) Whoever dumps garbage or release waste water into Graveyard shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or with both.

24. Folding of Cement Blocks:

- (1) No person or company or agency shall be allowed to engage in folding cement blocks along the main roads and in residential areas.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or his /her properties shall be confiscated.

Restaurants, Hotels and Lodges or Guesthouses

25. Restaurants, Hotels and Lodges or Guesthouses:

- (1) All restaurants, hotels and lodges or guesthouses shall have license or permit and the holder shall display his/her permit at a visible place.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or closure of the place.
- (3) All owners of restaurants, hotels and lodges or guesthouses are required to operate the national T.V channels during the News Hours and public occasions.
- (4) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or closure of the place.
- (5) All restaurants constructed with local materials are required to be constructed with permanent materials.
- (6) Whoever does not compliance with this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 75,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or closure of the restaurant place or with both.
- (7) All restaurants shall have public health provisions, good sewage and septic tanks.
- (8) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 25,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or closure of the restaurant place or with both.
- (9) All Restaurants, Hotels and guesthouses shall not allow serving dog or any unauthorized meats to customers.

- (10) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months for the first time and Closure of the restaurants for the second time.
- (11) No person is allowed to enter a hotel, lodge or guesthouse with underage school girls for sex intention.
- (12) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or closure of the place.

26. People working in Restaurants, Lodges, Guesthouses and Hotels Places:

- (1) Any person working in the restaurant places, food shops, stores shall have a valid health medical certificate.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 15,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two weeks or with both.

27. The environment health in Hotels:

- (1) The environment health in hotels shall be clean from dirt, dust or any other contamination during storage, distribution and sale of food.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 100,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding four months or with both.

28. The environment health in Restaurants:

- (1) The environment health in restaurants shall be clean from dirt, dust or any other contamination during storage, distribution and selling of food.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 100,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding four months or with both.

29. The environment Health in Lodges or guesthouse:

- (1) The environment health in lodges or guesthouses shall be clean from dirt, dust or any other contamination during storage, distribution and sale of food.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 100,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or with both.

30. The environment health in Bakeries:

- (1) All bakeries places shall have valid licence or permit from concern authority and the holder shall display his/ her licence at a visible place.
- (2) Whoever contrivance this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 75,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.
- (3) All bakeries shall have public health provision and good sewage and septic tanks.
- (4) Whoever contrivance this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 150,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months.
- (5) Any person working in bakeries place shall have medical certificate and dress clean uniform.
- (6) Whoever contrivance this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 15,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one week.
- (7) All bakeries places shall have store place for firewood inside plot boundary.
- (8) Whoever contrivance this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one week.

31. Open Air Eating Places:

- (1) Every open air eating place shall operate under the following requirements:
 - (a) City Council Authority shall approve its design structure and should contain adequate sanitary facilities.
 - (b) All persons carrying or handling the food must have valid medical health certificate.
 - (c) The permit holder shall provide adequate fire lighting facilities located strategically within the structure.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 25,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two weeks or with both.

32. Sale of Ice cream or fruits drinks:

- (1) Any person engages in Ice Cream or fruits drinks business shall obtain permit from concern Authorities.
- (2) All Ice Cream or fruits drinks shall be protected from dirt, dust or any other contamination during storage, distribution and sale.
- (3) Every permit holder shall:
 - (a) Maintain the premise clean at all time.
 - (b) Keep all utensils, vessels used for Ice Cream storage, distribution or sale, clean and sterilized.
 - (c) Not to employ any person suffering from infectious or contagious transmittable or venereal diseases, and in case of any infection, the medical health officer should be notified immediately.
- (4) Whoever contravenes these sub-section (1,2 and 3 above) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 100,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or with both or withdrawal of licenses.

33. Tea and Local ice-cream Sellers:

- (1) Any person engages in tea/local ice-cream business should obtain permit and Public Health Medical Certificate from Blocks Council or Juba City Authority.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 15,000 SSP or Imprisonment for a term not exceeding three Weeks or Closure of the place.

34. Workers (Waiters) dress in food places:

- (1) Any person who works in food places shall put on clean dress authorized by the public health Department.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 15,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three weeks.

35. Inspection of Food Places:

- (1) Any Health Inspector/Administrative officer on duty has a right to inspect food places, food shops and stores within Juba City.
- (2) Whoever rejects or obstructs an officer from doing inspection shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months or with both.

36. Closure of Local Lodges or Guesthouses in Residential Areas:

- (1) All owners of plots and operators of local lodges in residential areas without approval from relevant authorities are required to cancel his purpose of business which becomes source of insecurity and health hazard.
- (2) Whoever rejects an officer from doing inspection shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 400,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or with both and the lodge or guesthouse shall be closed.

Chapter Seven

Night Clubs, Discos and Bar Places

37. Organization of Night Clubs and Disco places:

- (1) Any person who owns night club(s) and Disco places shall:
- (a) Operate in location approved by Quarter, Block and Juba City Councils.
 - (b) Acquire license and operation certificate from Block Council or Juba City Council.
 - (c) Ensure that, Children or any person under age of 18 years shall not be allowed to enter and purchase alcoholic beverages.
 - (d) Provide adequate security and light system within the vicinity of the facility.
 - (e) Ensure clean environment and provide basic sanitary and toilets, urinal for both males and females.
 - (f) Ensure that, drainages or sewage shall not lead to contamination or pollution of any water sources and general environment.
 - (g) Requested to make necessary procedures with authorities of Block Council or Juba City to permit operation of their businesses.
 - (h) All owners and managers of night clubs, discos and bars are allowed to operate from 5:00 PM to 11:00 PM daily.
- (2) Whoever contravenes these sub-sections (a, b, c, d, e, f, g, and h above) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,000,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or with both.

38. Party or Occasions within Residential Areas:

- (1) Any person residing within the Quarter Council intending to have a party should obtain a permit from Quarter Council or Block Council Authority.

(2) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one week or with both.

39. Operation time for Liquor bars:

(1) All liquor bars within Residential areas shall be operating from 5:00 PM to 11:00 PM daily during working days with the exception of Saturdays, Sunday and public holidays.

(2) All liquor bars requested to be registered and licensed

(3) All liquor bars shall not be sold to boys or girls under age of 18 years.

(4) Whoever contravenes with these sub-sections (1, 2 and 3) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or with both.

40. Business in Juba City shall be categories between wholesalers and retailers:

1. Any trader dealing with essential commodities shall not be allowed to sell beer or alcohol within the same shop.

2. Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,000,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both or withdrawal of license.

3. All wholesale traders shall not be allowed to sell petty or retail goods within their wholesale shops.

4. Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months or with both or withdrawal of the license.

5. The selling of illegal drug substances including opium, shisha and marunge are not allowed in Juba City markets.

6. Whoever contrivances this sub-section shall be liable for fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months.

Random Slaughter of Animals

41. Random Slaughter of Animals:

- (1) All approved slaughter animals shall be slaughtered after medical check-up and stamp.
- (2) All animals shall have vaccination card from public health of veterinary department.
- (3) All animals shall be slaughtered only at the slaughter house.
- (4) No butcher shall be allowed to slaughter any animal, be it cow, bull, goat, sheep or pig outside the authorized slaughter houses.
- (5) No animals shall be slaughtered in the residential areas or in unauthorized places.
- (6) All workers working in slaughter house shall dress clean uniform authorized by the public health department.
- (7) Any employee in slaughter house shall obtain medical health certificate from concern authority.
- (8) Whoever contravenes these sub-sections (1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 above) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 250.000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or with both.
- (9) All chicken traders or distributors shall obtain business permit from Juba City Council, health Certificate from authorized public health department or Veterinary Certificate for Stock before distribution.
- (10) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 250,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months or with both.

42. Movement of Animals:

- (1) Any person in possession of cows, sheep, goats and pigs shall be required to tie/keep their animal in compound or residence.
- (2) Any animal found not tied down or seen roaming around in Juba City shall be captured and kept in custody.
- (3) Whoever contravenes these sub-sections (1 and 2 above) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP per each animal.
- (4) Whoever fails to pay the fine within 48 hours the animal captured shall be confiscated.

43. Slaughtering of Dogs:

- (1) No person is allowed to slaughter non-eatable animals (dog, cat) for the purpose of eating or selling its meats to the public.
- (2) All restaurants, hotels, lodges and guesthouses shall not be allowed to serve dog or cat's meats to customers.
- (3) Whoever contravenes these sub-sections (1 and 2 above) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,000,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term of six months or with both.

Prohibited Commercial Activity, Money Exchange and Hawking

44. Prohibited Commercial Activity, Money Exchange and Hawking:

- (1) The purpose of this section shall be to :
 - (a) Protect economic performance, prevent and control circulation of fault currencies.
 - (b) Prohibit illegal open and unauthorized dealings in money outside official institutions.
- (2) This section provides that:
 - (a) All dealers or institutions dealing in local and foreign currencies shall be required to possess all relevant legal requirements from Central Bank of Republic of South Sudan (CBSS) and other related institutions.
 - (b) All money dealers shall be registered and licensed by the Central Bank of South Sudan (CBSS).
 - (c) Any authorized person(s) or institutions shall not be allowed to practice money exchange, buying and selling outside the forex.
- (3) Any person(s) or institution (s) whoever contravenes this sub-section 2 above shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,000,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months and the money shall be confiscated with warning for the first time.
- (4) Any person(s) or unauthorized institutions who violate this section for the second time he/she shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year and the money shall be confiscated or with both and in collaborations with other laws.

- (5) No Persons or institutions shall engage in prohibited activity or any other banking activity for criminal purposes money laundering, terrorist financing.
- (6) Whoever Contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 3,000,000 SSP or in imprisonment for a term not exceeding three years or both.

45. Hawkers in Juba City:

- (1) Any person without a valid permit or hawks in undesignated area risks having their goods impounded or confiscated.
- (2) Each person engages in hawking shall have a badge and wear it at a visible place.
- (3) Juba City Council Administrative officers have a right to inspect any goods/ items being hawked.
- (4) No hawkers shall be allowed to operate their business without approval from Juba City Council or Block Council authority.
- (5) Whoever contravenes these sub-sections (1, 2 and 3 above) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 200,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.
- (6) All foreigners residing within Juba City Civil Residents are required to report their living to the Quarter Councils Authorities upon settlement or when quitting the area
- (7) All foreigners with Temporary Travel permit shall renew their permit as required by the immigration authorities stating a type of work they are doing in Juba City.
- (8) Whoever contravenes these sub-sections (6 and 7 above) the Quarter Councils Authorities shall report to the Concern Authorities for investigation and deportation.

46. Selling of Second-hand underwear, women breast covers and socks:

- (1) No person is allowed to sell second-hand underwear, women breast covers and socks in Juba City markets.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 250,000 SSP and confiscation of the goods or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.

47. Encroachment and Obstruction into Roads:

- (1) No person shall be allowed to extend his/her building, fence, into a neighbour's plot, government's plot, open space or road.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both and the structure shall be demolished.
- (3) No person shall be allowed to destroy the lighting on the public road and pavements of the tarmac save.
- (4) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.
- (5) No vehicle shall be allowed to destroy or to knock the lighting and a telephone line poles, sign posts, communication antennas and pavement of the tarmac road.
- (6) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding the total expenses for damage and the vehicle should be detained till he/she clear the bill.

48. Generators:

- (1) All private Generators who supply places with Electricity shall not connect the electricity wares to government public poles and shall not cross plot of neighbour.

(2) Whoever contrivance with this sub-section shall be liable for fine not less than 250,000 SSP or imprisonment not exceeding six months or both

49. Practice of Prostitution:

- (1) No person shall be allowed to practice prostitution in any house or place of business or lodges or guesthouse or hotels or restaurants or in the markets.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or with both.
- (3) No person shall be allowed to allow his/her house or place of business or lodge or guesthouse or hotel or restaurant to practice prostitution.
- (4) No person shall be allowed to rent her/his plot, place or house for the practicing of prostitution.
- (5) Whoever contravenes these sub-section (3 and 4 above) he/she shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 2,500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year for the first time and in case of repeated default for three times his/her place of business shall be closed down upon withdrawal of the trading license in case of South Sudanese National or the plot shall be confiscated or deportation in case of foreigner.
- (6) No person shall be allowed to practice homosexual within Juba City Council.
- (7) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for fine not exceeding 5,000,000SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years or with both.

50. Building Small and Random Tukuls (Rokuba) for Rent:

- 1) All landlords should avoid erecting small and random Tukuls for renting within their plots.
- 2) Whoever contravenes this sub- section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 250,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both and the tukuls shall be demolished.

51. Building without Construction Permit:

- (1) No business holders, companies and organization shall be allowed to construct houses or business places randomly without approvals from Juba City Council.
- (2) Whoever violates approved building plans or maps shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months or with both.
- (3) No person (s) is allowed to construct any structure or building, be it permanent or temporary on an unauthorized plot documents without consent of the area or Juba City Council Authority.
- (4) Whoever constructs a structure (building) on an unauthorized or someone's plot without the consent of the concerned authorities committed an offence punishable by law and shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,500.000SSP and destruction or demolishing of the structure at the earlier stage and in any case of objection he/ she shall be liable for an imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years.
- (5) No person(s) or institutions or companies or business places or lodges or guesthouses or hotels or restaurants shall be allowed to place a generator, machine or any other heavy objects outside plots boundary.
- (6) Whoever places a generator, machine or other heavy objects outside plot's boundary shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months or the equipment shall be confiscated.

- (7) No person(s) or institution or company or hotel or lodge or guesthouse or restaurant or business places shall be allowed to construct a drainage system, septic and water tank contrary to approved plan or map by Juba City Council.
- (8) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months or with both or the drainage system, septic tank and water tank shall be demolish.
- (9) No person shall be allowed to change the plot's allotment purpose without the notice of Juba City Council.
- (10) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding
500,000 SSP and payment of the fees for changing the purpose.
- (11) Any person who sells his/her plot shall pay to Block Council concern, the sum of
5% from the sale value of the plot.
- (12) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding
500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months
- (13) No person shall be allowed to leave building remnants on roads after completion of
construction.
- (14) Whoever fails to clear out building remnants on roads after completion of construction shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months.

Organization of Public Transport

52. Entering and moving of heavy trucks:

- (1) All heavy trucks, long vehicles, fuel tankers shall be allowed to:
 - (a) Enter Juba City from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. and from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. daily.
 - (b) Move within Juba City from 3:00 a.m. To 7:00 a.m. and from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and from 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. daily.
- (2) No heavy trucks, long vehicles, tippers and other Lorries shall be allowed to use the main road from Juba town roundabout through Muduria roundabout to the Ministries road and from Muduria roundabout through Juba Teaching Hospital to Mobil roundabout daily during working hours.
- (3) No water tankers and tipper-lorries shall be allowed to use main roads in the town from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. daily.
- (4) All heavy trucks, long vehicles, tipper lorries and vehicles carrying Murom, Aggregates, soil , hard core (stones) and sand shall be covered with canvas sheeting.
- (5) Whoever contravenes these sub-sections (1, 2, 3 and 4) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months or withdrawal of driving license or with both.
- (6) All the following vehicles shall be exempted from these sections:
 - (a) Government of RSS, States, Local Government.
 - (b) Ministry of Defence and other Organized Forces.
 - (c) Diplomatic Corps (CD)
 - (d) UN agencies and International Humanitarian Organizations.

- (7) No heavy commercial trucks, long vehicles and fuel tankers shall be allowed to park along the main roads more than three days.
- (8) No broken vehicle is allowed to remain parked on the main roads for more than one week.
- (9) Whoever contravenes with sub-sections (7 and 8) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months or with both.

53. Parking of Fuel and Sewage Tankers in Residential Areas:

- (1) No fuel or sewage tankers shall be allowed to park within residential areas.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,000,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or with both.
- (3) All buses shall be parked at a park/ terminus and will only stop to pick or drop passengers at a designated bus stop.
- (4) All buses in Bus Park / terminals must follow direction and instructions of Juba City Council and traffic Authorities.
- (5) Whoever contravenes these sub-sections (3 and 4 above) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 100,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.
- (6) All public transports, boda boda, raksha, private vehicle shall not be allowed to park or to pick or drop passengers at roundabout, traffic light or between. no parking only in designated bus stop and parking areas.
- (7) No person or business places and institutions shall be allowed to put sign of no parking in his place without approval from concern authority (Juba City Council or Traffic police).
- (8) Whoever contravenes this sub-section (6/7) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 100,000 SSP or imprisonment for term not exceeding one month for the first time in case of repeated default for three times the license will be withdrawn.

54. Water Tankers.

- 1) All water tankers shall supply clean drinking water from water companies not directly from the river.
- 2) Whoever contrivances this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one Month.
- 3) All water Drivers and conductors shall have valid medical health certificate and sanitary license.
- 4) Whoever contrivances this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.
- 5) All water tanker drivers are not allowed to raise the prices of water supplied to citizens without approval from the Juba City Council Authority.
- 6) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 200,000SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.
- 7) All water tankers shall maintain general cleaning every three month as following:
 - (a) Maintain cleaning of water tankers.
 - (b) Paint water tankers.
 - (c) Maintain water pipes cleaning all time.
- 8) Whoever contrivance this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months.
- 9) Any person who wants water from river direct for purpose of building shall have permission from concern authority of Juba City Council.
- 10) Whoever contrivance this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.

55. Public Transport:

- (1) All public transport operating in Juba City shall be insured, licensed and good condition.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both and send back to the relevant authorities.
- (3) All public transport vehicles shall obtain route permit from Juba City Council.
- (4) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.
- (5) All public transport vehicles shall be drive by qualified South Sudanese who possess documents of eligibility and health certificate.
- (6) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.
- (7) All public transport vehicles shall have marks printed on both sides including the route approved to them.
- (8) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.
- (9) All public transport vehicles shall have fire extinguisher for safety of vehicles.
- (10) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.
 - a. All public transport vehicles shall have SSD number plate from the Authorities Concern.

b. Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.

(11) All public transport drivers are not allowed to increase the transport tariffs or create station without approval from Juba City Council Authority.

Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 100,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.

(12) All drivers and conductors shall not be allowed to be drunk during driving time.

(13) All bus conductors should be seated while on duty.

(14) Whoever contravenes these sub-sections (13 and 14 above) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.

(15) All foreigners and Nationals shall be allowed to drive public transport vehicles on the following conditions:

(a) Shall obtain legal documents from CES traffic police.

(b) Shall have undergone health and driving tests.

(c) National Foreigners shall be given driving licence for public transport but they must have General License from their Country of origin and persons from South Sudan to give recommendation /guarantee.

(15) Whoever contravenes these sub-sections (a, b, and c above) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 100,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.

(16) All public transport vehicles operating within Juba City shall renew their registration and insurance annually.

- (17) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.
- (18) No driver shall be allowed to block a road for Ambulance vehicles, Fire brigade, Rescue force and VIP's cars on duty.
- (19) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall liable for a fine not exceeding 150,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.
- (20) All vehicles (government, NGOs, CD & Private) are not allowed to move numberless or using single plate number in front or behind unless with approval from authorities concern. Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall liable for a fine not exceeding 100,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both.

56. Taxi – Cab Operation within Juba City:

- (1) All owners of Taxi-Cab shall be registered and obtain permit from Juba City Council Authorities.
- (2) All owners of Taxi-Cab shall be expected to take his/her Car for inspection after every three Months
- (3) All Taxi Drivers shall be required to behave in a civil and orderly manner and ensure the safety of all passengers entering into or alighting from the vehicle.
- (4) All Taxi – cab shall be painted in Yellow colour with Juba City council logo or authorized colour.
- (5) Whoever contravenes these sub-sections (1, 2, 3 and 4) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one week and withdrawal of the license.

57. Motorcycle (Boda Boda), Motor carrier carts and handcarts:

- (1) a- All motorists shall obtain driving license from traffic police.

- b- All motorists shall put on head helmet.
- (2) No individual, government officials, organized forces, NGOs and Commercial motorcycle (Boda Boda) shall be allowed to ride motorcycle on road without number plate.
- (3) Whoever contravenes with subsections 1(a, b) and 2 above shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or the motorbike shall be arrested and detained in Juba City Council until he/she completes the legal requirements and after six months if he/she fails to do so, the motorbike shall be confiscated.
- (4) No person shall be allowed to cover and bend number plate to the extent of not seeing correctly.
- (5) No person shall be allowed to ride a motorcycle at the age below 18 years.
- (6) No person shall be allowed to pull items with motorcycle on the road: e.g. timbers, metals, bamboo among others.
- (7) No person shall be allowed to carry more than one people on motorcycle.
- (8) Whoever contravenes these sub-sections (4 , 5 , 6 and 7 above) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one Month or the motorcycle shall be confiscated or with both.

58. Petrol Stations:

- (1) All petrol stations shall not be allowed to hide petrol or diesel and sell it in black market.
- (2) All petrol stations shall not be allowed to sell petrol or diesel in barrel to individuals (hawkers or retailers) without permit from Juba City Council.

- (3) Whoever contravenes these sub-sections (1 and 2 above) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,000,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months or closure of Petrol station.
- (4) No person shall be allowed to sell the petrol or diesel along the main roads in litres or bottles within Juba city.
- (5) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or with both or the petrol or diesel shall be confiscated.
- (6) No fuel tanker or trailer shall be allowed to sell fuel (petrol or diesel) along the roads or in residential areas without approval from City Council Authorities.
- (7) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding One months or with both and Fuel shall be confiscated .
- (8) All petrol stations shall not be allowed to park private vehicles in their compound at day and night within Juba City Council.
- (9) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,000,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding Six month.

Destruction and Uprooting of Trees in Residential Areas and Streets in Juba City Council

59. Destruction and Uprooting of Trees in Residential Areas and Streets Juba City Council:

- (1) No person shall be allowed to tree-felling and uprooting of trees along public roads and residential areas without obtaining permission from relevant authorities.
- (2) Whoever contravenes with this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two weeks or with both.

Establishment of water closets and Pit Latrine in the residential areas

60. Establishment of water closets and Pit Latrine in the residential areas:

- (1) All owners of Plots within Juba City are requested to establish water closet or pit latrine in his/her residential areas.
- (2) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two weeks or with both.

61. General Public Nuisances:

- (1) No person shall be allowed to disturbed public tranquillity, shouting for passengers near Hospitals, Courts and Schools.
- (2) Any person shall be required to observe traffic or zebra crossing.
- (3) No person shall be allowed to play any game, riding or driving or propelling on a foot path.
- (4) No person shall be allowed to spoil any building by writing signs or grafting (graphing).
- (5) Whoever contravenes these sub-sections (1,2, 3 and 4 above) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 25,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two weeks or with both.

Drug Stores/Pharmacies/Private Clinics

62. Organization of Drug Stores/ Pharmacies/ Private Clinics

- (1) All Drug stores/Pharmacies and private Clinics shall have valid license from state ministry of health and Juba City council (JCC).
- (2) Whoever contrivances this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,000,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months.
- (3) All Drug stores /Pharmacies and Private Clinics shall not be allowed to sell expired / illicit medicines.
- (4) All Pharmacies/ drug stores and private clinics shall not allow selling of medicines without receipt from legal doctor.
- (5) Whoever contrivances these sub-sections (3 and 4) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months.
- (6) All pharmacies/ drug stores and Private clinics shall have a Doctor with valid license from medical council.
- (7) Whoever contrivances this sub-section shall be liable for fine not exceeding 1,000,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months.
- (8) All owners of Pharmacies/Drug stores and private clinics shall keep their medical waste in safety box for safe disposal.
- (9) Whoever contrivances this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 250,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months.
- (10) All owners of Pharmacies/ Drug stores and Private Clinics are required to install their business name in a visible place.

(11) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 150,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.

63. Witchcraft:

(1) No Person shall be allowed to Practice any form of witchcraft medicine in Juba City Council.

(2) No person shall be allowed to open a place for practicing witchcraft within the areas of Juba City Council.

(3) No person shall be allowed to give or rent his/ her house / plot for witchcraft practicing within Juba City.

(4) Whoever contravenes these sub-sections (1, 2 and 3) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term of three months.

64. Pandemic diseases threats:

1. All citizens in Juba City shall have to comply with and respect the directives, orders and measures introduced by the ministry of health regarding the widespread of pandemic diseases.
2. Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two weeks.
3. All citizens shall have to wear facemask during the spread of the pandemic Diseases.
4. Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term of two weeks.
5. All citizens shall have to maintain the social distancing in public places during the spread of The Pandemic Diseases.
6. Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term of Two weeks.
7. All citizens shall have to abide to the curfew imposed by the authority during the Spread Of The Pandemic Diseases and insecurity.
8. Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term of Two weeks.
9. Any person is not allowed to snake the border during the fatal diseases.
10. Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 50,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term of Two weeks.

Public order and security

65. Public order:

- 1) Any person is required to dress decently and avoid transparent, tied wearing and display of women naked in which encouraging sexual abuse and raping.
- 2) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 25,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.
- 3) No person (s) is allowed defecating or urinating on a street or any open space or at wall.
- 4) No Persons is allowed to smoke in public Places. Only in design Smoking Area.
- 5) Whoever contravenes this sub-section (3/4) shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 25,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding One Month.
- 6) All owners of plots (residential or businesses) along the main roads or streets within Juba City shall construct concrete fence (wall) and complete the space between his/her fence and the Tarmac with inter-lock bricks, with support of Juba City Council Authority.
- 7) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 20,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding Two Weeks.
- 8) No bodaboda/motorcycles are allowed to congest or initiate parking lots unnecessarily.
- 9) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 20,000 SSP or imprisonment for term not exceeding two Weeks.

- 10) No person(s) is allowed to dig the streams within the Juba City for bricks moulding and smoking.
- 11) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 20,000SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two Weeks.
- 12) All business holders, companies, hotels, pharmacies, bakeries, public transport and water tankers are not allowed to raise the prices without notifying or get permission from concern authorities (Ministry of Trade and Juba City Council)
- 13) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for term not exceeding one month.
- 14) Creating groups to practice criminal acts and activities that create fear and social destabilization in Juba City is not allowed.
- 15) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable for a fine not exceeding 1,000,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years.
- 16) No Person, wholesalers, retailers and restaurants shall be allowed to sell shisha, maarunge, hashish tobacco in His/hers place in juba city.
- 17) Whoever contravenes this sub-section shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 500,000 SSP or imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months.
- 18) No Persons or Companies is Allowed to Dig The Main Road or Feeder Road (Tarmac) Without notifying or getting Approval from Concern Authorities Ministry of road and Juba City Council.
- 19) Whoever Contravene This sub-Section Shall be liable for Fine not Exceeding 1,000.000 SSP or Imprisonment for a term not exceeding One Year.
