Transition of International Flight Operations to Terminal 3 at Juba International Airport

The Management of the South Sudan Civil Aviation Authority (SSCAA) is pleased to inform all South Sudanese citizens at home and in the diaspora, as well as our valued international travellers and aviation stakeholders, that following the official inauguration of Terminal 3 for International Passengers at Juba International Airport on 16 July 2016, the Authority has commenced the phased transition of airline operations from the former Terminal 2 to the newly commissioned Terminal 3.

This transitional process is aimed at fully operationalizing Terminal 3 and enhancing passenger experience through improved airport infrastructure, safety, security, and service delivery.

As part of this transition, passengers are advised that:

- International airlines will progressively relocate their operations from Terminal 2 to Terminal 3 according to an approved operational schedule.
- Apron shuttle buses will be deployed to facilitate the safe and efficient movement of passengers between the terminal building and aircraft where required.
- Passengers are encouraged to follow airport directional signage and the instructions of airport staff and airline representatives throughout the transition period.

The South Sudan Civil Aviation Authority appreciates the understanding, patience, and cooperation of all passengers, airlines, and stakeholders as we implement this important milestone in the modernization of Juba International Airport.
